## **SAFE WORK PRACTICES**

- Do not perform the procedure or operate the equipment until you have been appropriately trained and authorized to do so by your supervisor.
- Inspect required personal protective equipment (PPE) and replace if required.
- Do not wear loose-fitting clothing, dangling jewelry, etc.
- Do not carry on a conversation while cutting pay attention to task at hand.

## **PROCEDURE**

- 1. Position body so that it is not in line with blade.
- 2. The height of blade should be set slightly higher than thickness of stock being cut.
- 3. Always stand firmly on the floor.
- 4. Do not reach over or behind blade unless it has stopped turning.
- 5. Do not leave the saw until blade has stopped.
- 6. Always unplug the saw before changing the blade or performing other maintenance. Follow LOTO procedure.
- 7. Make sure blade has stopped before making blade adjustments (i.e., height, angle).
- 8. Ensure the guard is in place and operates properly.
- 9. Ensure guides are in place and tabletop is smooth and polished.
- 10. Maintain the rip fence parallel to the blade keep the blade sharp.
- 11. Check throat plate to ensure proper fit and secured.
- 12. Do not make hands free cuts (use rip fence or mitre gauge).
- 13. Work should be released only when it has gone past the blade.
- 14. Check stock is free of nails, stones, etc.
- 15. Do not adjust fence while saw is running.
- 16. Use push stick for ripping stock between 50 mm and 150 mm wide.
- 17. Do not rip any stock less than 50 mm wide unless a safe jig is set up.
