



Call for Nominations for the Maple League Teaching Fellowship

Overview

The Maple League Teaching and Learning Committee has developed a Maple League Teaching Fellowship that aims to promote teaching and learning at each of its universities, support teachers in their development as practitioners and educational leaders, and foster a robust and caring community of teachers within its four universities. The purpose of the Fellowship is to develop individual teaching and learning projects by each Fellow, to support that Fellow in their work through student support funding, and to disseminate the findings of their research or skills development throughout the League and beyond.

For the first three years of the pilot program, one Fellow will be chosen from each of the Maple League institutions.

Programming

Each winner of the Maple League Teaching Fellowship will individually develop a comprehensive program for the member institutions which will be laid out in the Statement of Purpose. It is hoped that as Fellows are selected each year, a kind of retreat or cohort of Fellows could meet and develop projects together in years to come. In other words, the award does not just last for a year, but hopefully extends into building a community of scholars that can continue with rich collaboration and exchange.

What to Submit

- A cover letter, including a Statement of Purpose in which the nominee clearly outlines a program they would like to offer over the course of the upcoming year for the Maple League Institutions. This can range from workshops and individual mentorship to organizing conferences and working groups.
- A dossier (max 20 pages) including teaching philosophy, a statement documenting teaching leadership, student and faculty letters of support (no more than three each), examples of effective teaching, and student evaluations of teaching (narrative or numerical).

Funding:

The Fellowship does not come with remuneration but with a student assistant to help with the execution of the program.

Deadline and dates
